A Message from the Rector

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE MY ARRIVAL, just over two years ago, we are experiencing financial difficulties; one could even argue that we are approaching a financial crisis. The vestry is being good stewards of the finances; in fact we have controlled our spending, spending less than our projected budget for this time of the year. Yet, there remains a short fall of funds.

The vestry and I have discussed several ways to reduce our spending even more, mostly this has to do with the parish becoming more "green." In other words, conserving energy where we can: lights, gas, electric, heat and air conditioning, etc. While the vestry is doing its part to ensure we are spending our money wisely, we are well aware of the fact that the shortfall of money is not and cannot be attributed to the spending side of our budget, but rather to the income side. We simply are not receiving enough in the offering plate each week to keep up with the basic needs of the parish.

Usually, there is a decline in giving during the summer months. This can be attributed to family vacations and, due to the sunny warm weather, people choose to do other things rather than attend church. The summer months always present a bit of a financial "crunch" for the church, but June is far too early for us to be experiencing a short fall. In fact, if the current trend continues through the summer, with its traditional short fall of finances, this could pose an even greater problem. Hence, the vestry is addressing this issue now. But, ultimately the burden of this problem falls on every member of this parish. We all must give, and not only

give but we must begin to move our giving toward a tithe, which is 10% of our income.

Though the summertime traditionally brings a drought in attendance and financial giving, it is not an acceptable Christian response to our Lord. Nowhere in scripture or in the historic tradition and teachings of the Church does it allow for "time off" or "time away" from worshipping our Lord. In fact, scripture demands our regular attendance and our financial support, which should be the Biblical principal for giving—a tithe—10%.



God has blessed us greatly here at St. Luke's, and He has given us a vision for the future. He has laid before us ministries to which we must attend. The vestry and I are excited about what we believe God is calling us to do. However, it will take all of us, each doing his/her part, to fulfill God's purpose and will for St. Luke's

I am confident of your response to the needs of our beloved parish. I ask each and every one of you to commit yourselves anew to the ministry of this parish, both with your active participation and with your financial support. Together, through our willingness and openness, God can and will do a mighty work at St. Luke's.

Please pray for our beloved parish.

May our Crucified, Risen and Ascended Lord Jesus Christ continue to bless you.

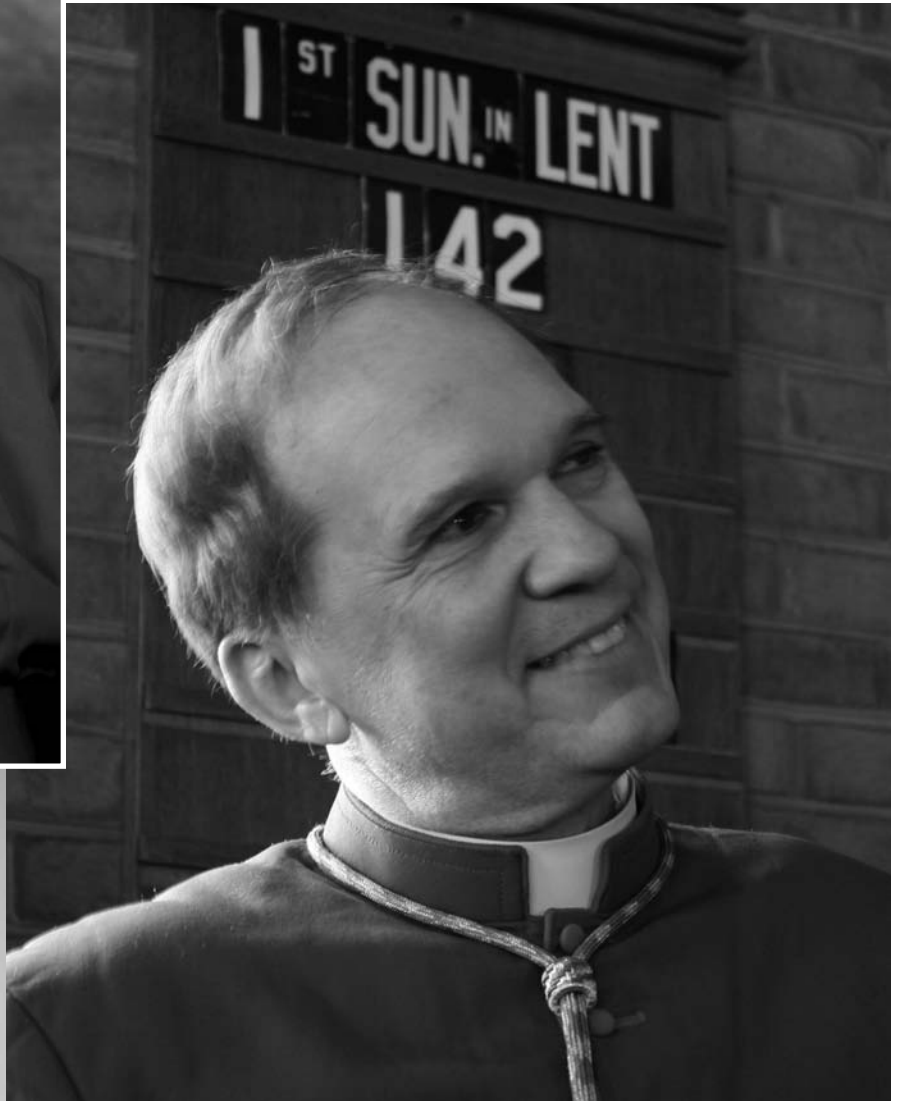

Treasurer's Report April 2008

I have changed the format of this report to help me explain how our income and expenses work. Money given for Building Improvements, Furnace Fund, or our outreach programs (concerts, SHARE, etc.), is not available for general purposes like paying utilities and regular operating expenses. So, although it appears that we have extra money to date, the \$7,363 net income from designated offerings can only be used for the specified purposes. Regular operating bills cannot be paid with designated funds so we are actually at a \$3,377 loss as of the end of this month. The reality is that we have insufficient funds to pay our bills. Please review your giving to our church. We rely on your offerings and our church can not continue with our ministry and keep the doors open if we do not pay our bills.

Pew Plaques

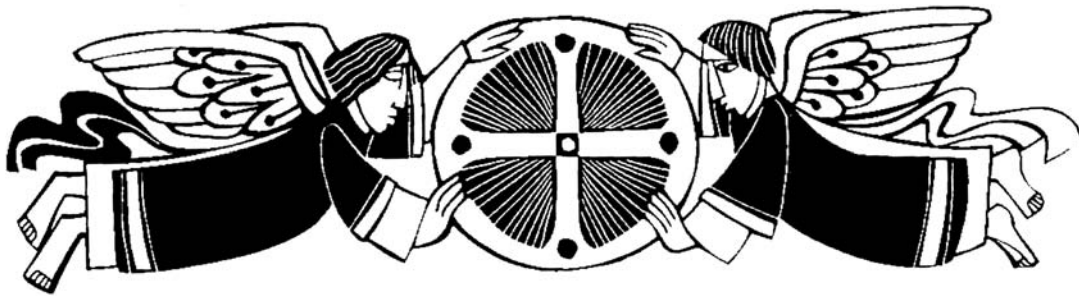

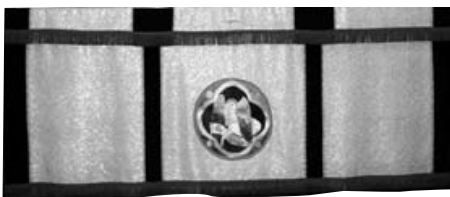

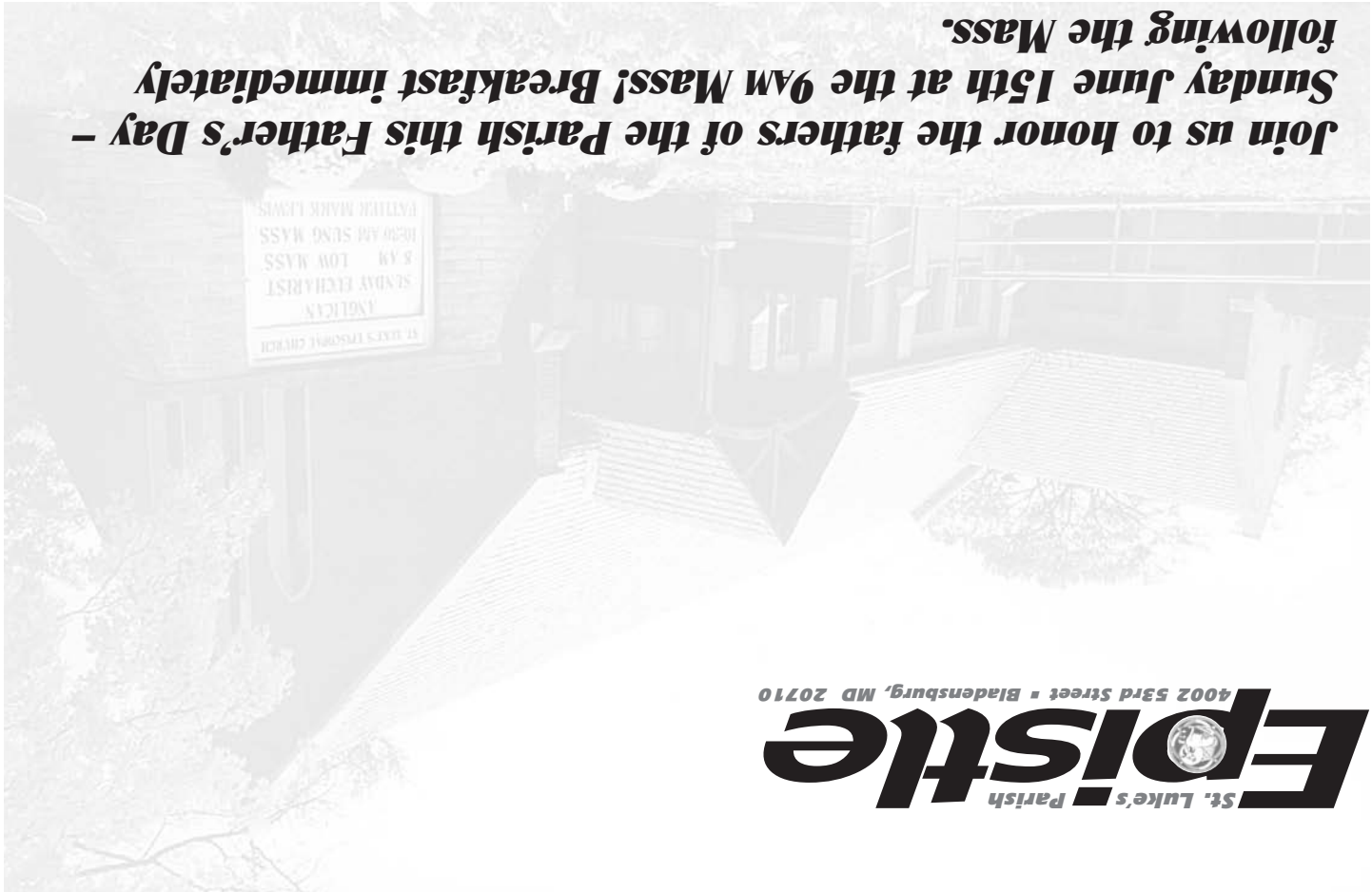
